Ashley volunteers on the **Women's Leadership Advisory Committee**, a network of alumni who provide mentorship opportunities for students. She is co-chairing their upcoming inaugural **Women's Leadership Summit**.

Ashley's parents instilled in her the value of supporting education. She has recognized that as a scholarship recipient at Seton Hall Law, she had opportunities that might not have been possible if she had a heavier financial burden. This inspired her to also start giving back to the school through financial contributions.

Ashley and her husband recently established the **Ashley Turner '10 and Alan Kubey Graduates of the Last Decade (G.O.L.D.) Scholarship**. G.O.L.D. Scholarships are multi-year philanthropic gifts funded by alumni who have graduated from the law school in the last decade.

"I felt it was important to be able to help another law student to have some of the opportunities that I did ... There's something about being able to make a tangible difference in one student's experience at the school that was very appealing."

Ashley and Alan's scholarship supports strong students with financial need, but also specifically seeks to support students who participate in the women's law forum student organization, or whose background contributes to the diversity of the student body. Ashley explains, "I think it's important for the progress of the law school and for the legal profession that we are assisting and advocating for a diverse student body and a diverse workforce."

Through both her volunteering and philanthropy, Ashley is demonstrating ways alumni can remain engaged and exemplify their loyalty to Seton Hall Law. "I really just hope that that through our scholarship and through my volunteering we're able to positively impact the experiences of a few of the students there."
